


President's Piece - March 2024

This month Professor Laurence Melton is going to talk about Precision genetic engineering (CRISPR), one of the marvels of today's scientific breakthroughs.



Our March speaker is Laurence Melton Emeritus Professor, Faculty of Science, University of Auckland

His subject will be Precision genetic engineering (CRISPR), one of the most important scientific breakthroughs of the 21st century so far. It has the potential to cure many serious diseases such as cystic fibrosis, Huntington's disease, haemophilia. Cures for sickle cell disease and thalassaemia have already been developed.

Further, it is being used to breed crops and animals to deal with climate change (e.g. cows that fart less, produce more milk and cope with increasing temperatures).

The Role and Tasks performed by the Remuera U3A Vice President.

Prior to accepting the position last year, I had been asked a number of times to be Vice President. My answer each time was that I had not lived the type of life that meant I would be able to get speakers for the meeting. I need not have worried! Getting speakers was easy, with well over twenty suggestions during the year. Choosing who to ask was the hard part. My experience was that people were only too keen to come and talk to us. I thoroughly enjoyed the year and it was fun meeting the speaker and the duties detailed below were by no means arduous.

General duties for the VP.

- Stand in for the President in the event of their absence.
- Arrange the speakers for the monthly meeting. There are pro forma letters for seeking speakers, confirming speakers and thanking speakers.
- Ensure that the Secretary and Newsletter Editor have a list of speakers for two months ahead.
- If you are absent for any reason, ensure that someone has been asked to introduce and thank the speaker.
- Be available for the committee meetings held approximately two monthly.

On the day of the meeting

- Allocate a parking space for the speaker usually first space in car park. There is a sign that goes in car space for the speaker.
- Put in place our U3A pavement sign, uplift it after the meeting and store it until next meeting.
- Greet the speaker.
- After the President's welcome to the meeting, introduce the speaker. Thank the speaker after their presentation and arrange for a bank transfer of \$100 to the speaker's nominated account, to be made by our Treasurer.
