Speaker for October

Our speaker for October is Carmel Claridge. Carmel may already be known to some of you from her time as Deputy Chairman of the Orakei Local Board. Carmel has an eclectic background, working at various stages of her life as a lawyer, fitness consultant, cleaner, dog groomer, social housing navigator, and now Coordinator of Te Kōti o Timatanga Hou/Court of New Beginnings.

Carmel is passionate about her mahi at Te Kōti o Timatanga Hou and feels privileged to share the TKTH journey with some of our most disadvantaged and vulnerable members of society – the homeless.

Te Kōti o Timatanga Hou/Court of New Beginnings, is a therapeutic specialist Court set up in 2010 in response to concerns about recidivist, low-level, public nuisance offending in the Auckland CBD area. Evaluations of the Court have shown a



significant reduction in arrests, nights spent in prison, and accident and emergency visits. Te Kōti o Timatanga Hou is a proven"circuit breaker" for many caught in the revolving door, between prison and the street. It offers guidance and hope to a better life path for those who have the courage to change.

Mary Gray, speaks about Ans Westra, photographer

Ans was a notable New Zealand photographer and her speciality was capturing the everyday life of New Zealanders.



Her photos tell stories of life in NZ through the sixties up until her death in 2023. She ranged far and wide in NZ, travelling the length of the country, often sleeping in her VW.

Later, she received commissions for her work and produced several books, including the notable 'Washday at the Pa' which caused controversy at the time.

Our Speaker for November is Professor Emeritus Peter Lineham

Peter Lineham is a Professor Emeritus, meaning he has retired from his role as Professor of History at Massey University and Regional Director of the College of Humanities and Social Sciences. However, he remains associated with the University in an honorary role.

Peter is a respected scholar whose interests cover a range of subject areas that can loosely be categorised under history and religion. He was awarded Membership of the Order of New Zealand in the New Year Honours list in 2019. He has written articles on many aspects of English and New Zealand religious history and his books include *There we found Brethren, No Ordinary Union* and *Bible and Society* and he co-edited the standard text on New Zealand's religious history, *Transplanted Christianity*.



In 2013 his book on Brian Tamaki and the Destiny Church, *Destiny; The Life and Times of a Self-Made Apostle* was the first full and independent account of the church and its personnel.
